"NO SUBTLE FORCES"

SILVERLENS presents *Nicole Coson*, *Dina Gadia*, *Pow Martinez*, and *Yee I-Lann* in a show of force of contemporary artists from the Asia Pacific. In Southeast Asia, where all are from originally, artists often come together through informal networks, establishing communities and collectives that become long-term structures of artistic collaboration and exchange.




Nicole Coson (b. 1992. Manila, lives and works in the UK) is a Filipino artist, who has completed an MA in Painting from the Royal College of Art in London. Coson's work operates between the anonymous and deeply personal, between a specific place in her personal history and anywhere at all. She creates works that seek to stretch and skew the viewer's ability to detect cultural precursors as identity and location blend into seamlessness constructing a space which is both familiar and alien. Her latest works function as architectural interventions of physical space, each work serving as a doorway into a dimension between worlds and beyond time.

Coson has been selected as part of Bloomberg New Contemporaries 2020. A much sought after emerging artist, recent shows include Exoskeleton (Silverlens, Manila), Windows (The Artist Room, London), Picture House (Brigade, Copenhagen), How To Cook a Wolf (Center for Book Arts, NYC), and Fortress (Ben Hunter Gallery, London).

In this series composed of large-scale monotype prints that diachronically plots the gradual breakdown of blinds, Coson ruminates on this prosaic architectural solution that negotiates the disclosure/exposure of private life as well as the extent to which the outside may be framed and observed, either through a small gap between the slats or their full retreat into the rail.

With the slats individually painted and laid gradually under the press, the blinds transmit their form onto the cloth. Through repeated pressing, the rhythmically meditative horizontal bands unravel, with the slats breaking away from a tightly rigorous pattern to an improvisatory mode sparked by the unforeseen tension between machine, matrix, and medium. Lines buckle, overlap, zigzag. Paint reveals cloth which reveals ultimately nothing: there is no there there.

DINA GADIA

Dina Gadia (b.1986, Pangasinan, Philippines; lives and works in Manila, Philippines) is an artist recognised for her visually arresting and playfully representational style. Her selected visuals evoke large localised contexts and people, reflecting relevant issues, such as postcolonial attitudes, disparate economic realities, and female inequity. Despite being known for jarring juxtapositions, Gadia imbues her paintings with a sense of humour, often portraying deadpan narrations through ironic visual puns. The artist thereby eliminates traces of sentimentality or self-righteous judgment in her creations. Gadia's recent mediums include collages, acrylic paintings, and flags embroidered on satin.

Gadia received a Bachelor's Degree of Fine Arts in Advertising from Far Eastern University. She has exhibited extensively since 2005, leading solo presentations both locally and internationally in New York, Taipei, Singapore, and Tokyo. In 2018, she was awarded the prestigious national Thirteen Artists Awards by the Cultural Center of the Philippines. In 2019, Gadia participated in City Prince/sses at the Palais de Tokyo in Paris.

All States No State (2018-2019) is a series of works of flags – their symbols, decorativeness, identity and representation in mind. It is embroidered by the oldest flag-makers in the Philippines whose craft spans generations.

"I have been exploring this medium since 2011. The idea came up again when I saw flags in a graduation ceremony arranged in a stage. At the same time, news about politics are all over wherein the photos and clips are of world leaders in offices, or addressing their speech and the representing flag or flags are naturally part of the interior and setting. I thought to make a work that reflect the signs of the times and not necessarily the political weight in the air. I chose satin as material because it has a certain intensity that is difficult to use. I was challenging myself with using and applying the colors I encountered and to place emphasis or at least show the harmony."

Pow Martinez (b.1983)'s paintings belie their grotesque subject matter with the indelibly beautiful surfaces and a wide-ranging, daring use of color. Mutants, monsters, demons, deviants, and freaks lurch, sit, and appear to transform amidst weirdly lit landscapes or disintegrating urban scenarios, or emerge from a painterly graffito mess, but, as his more abstracted works insist, Martinez' ability to render intriguing relationships between forms and surfaces ensure his works are endlessly compelling—an experience akin to a beautiful nightmare.

Martinez exhibits internationally and has worked with different media, including sound. Recent exhibitions include 'Aesthetic Police' (2018) at ROH Projects, Jakarta, 'City Prince/sses' (2019) at Palais de Tokyo in Paris, 'Sustainable Anxiety' (2020) at Silverlens, and his latest solo exhibition entitled 'Underground Spiritual Unit' (2022) at Galería Yusto/Giner in Madrid.

YEE I-LANN



Yee I-Lann (b.1971, Kota Kinabalu) currently lives and works in Kota Kinabalu in the Malaysian Borneo state of Sabah. Her primarily photomedia-based practice engages with archipelagic Southeast Asia's turbulent history with works addressing issues of colonialism and neo-colonialism, power, and the impact of historic memory in social experience, often with particular focus on counter-narrative "histories from below". She employs a complex, multilayered visual vocabulary drawn from historical references, popular culture, archives, and everyday objects. She has in recent years started working collaboratively with sea-based and land-based communities and indigenous mediums in Sabah.

Recent solo exhibitions include 'Borneo Heart' at Sabah International Convention Centre in Malaysia and 'Until We Hug Again' at the Centre for Heritage Arts & Textile in Hong Kong. Recent group exhibitions include 'Art Histories of a Forever War' in Taipei Fine Arts Museum in Taiwan. and the 10th Asia Pacific Triennial of Contemporary Art in Brisbane, Australia. This year, she will be having a solo presentation at Art Basel Features and Unlimited. Her work will be seen at the upcoming Aichi Triennale in Japan and the Istanbul Biennale.

Many knowledges are at play in The Tukad Kad Sequence, as familiar imagery and ancient and new motifs are woven together – inherited old knowledge, personal memory, cultural theory.

"Linguistics has played a major role on our journey with the mat. One of the revelations I encountered was via a foundational weave type called 'Tukad' in the Dusun and Murut languages, meaning steps, as in stairs. As we talked about this Tukad weave, one of the weavers Siat, then later Julia, both referred to the texture "tukad kad" describing: "The ridges at the ceiling of your mouth - when they feel heat or acidity, they become more pronounced."

"Tukad Kad", then, is part of the cavity between the deeply private space inside our bodies and the external public space. It's the meeting of worlds if you like, the trigger site at which you consume and expel, a corporeal threshold between public and private."

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NICOLE COSON Bio

Nicole Coson (b. 1992, Manila, lives and works in the UK) aims to examine the concept of invisibility, not only as a passive position as a result of erasure, the problematic dichotomisation of culture but also its potential as an effective artistic strategy. Can invisibility be seen not just as a disability but as an advantage or ability? Like the optical survival strategies utilised by both prey and predator in the natural world? Who can benefit from this tactic of concealment and dissimulation and how can one apply these strategies?

In her work, Coson explores the economies of visibility and disappearance in the case of overlooked bodies, invisibility in warfare as tactical counter measures, and cultural visibility in art. Coson's work searches for a productive position within invisibility that lends us an opportunity in which we are able to negotiate the terms of our visibility. To vanish and reappear as we please and as necessary to our own personal and artistic objectives, to effectively disappear amongst the grass blades until the very moment we must break that illusion, the very moment when it is time to strike.


Gadia received a Bachelor's Degree of Fine Arts in Advertising from Far Eastern University. 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POW MARTINEZ

Bio

Pow Martinez (b. 1983) is a recipient of the 2010 Ateneo Art Award for his exhibition 1 Billion Years at West Gallery, Philippines. He exhibits internationally and has worked with different media, from painting to sound. His recent exhibitions include City Prince/sses (2019) at Palais de Tokyo in Paris; Art Jakarta 2019 with Silverlens and ROH Projects; 50 Years in Hollywood (2019) at Pinto Art Museum in New York; Art Basel Hong Kong 2019 with Silverlens; WXXX (2019), West Gallery, Manila; Art Taipei 2017; WASAK! Reloaded (2016) in Arndt, Singapore; and WASAK! (2016) inArndt, Berlin. Martinez has also held a number of solo shows in major galleries in Manila, the most recent of which is Techno-Utopian (2017) in Silverlens. Early in 2018, Martinez had his first solo exhibition in Indonesia. Titled Aesthetic Police, the exhibition is an outcome of his month-long residency program at OPQRStudio in Bandung.



Yee I-Lann (b.1971, Kota Kinabalu; lives and works in Kota Kinabalu in the Malaysian Borneo state of Sabah) primarily photomedia-based practice engages with archipelagic Southeast Asia's turbulent history with works addressing issues of colonialism and neo-colonialism, power, and the impact of historical memory in social experience, often with particular focus on counter-narrative "histories from below". She employs a complex, multi-layered visual vocabulary drawn from historical references, popular culture, archives, and everyday objects. She has in recent years started working collaboratively with sea-based and land-based communities and indigenous mediums in Sabah. She is a co-founding associate of The Ricecooker Archives: Southeast Asian Rock 'n' Roll Treasury with her partner Joe Kidd and has worked as a production designer in the Malaysian film industry. She is currently a Board member for Forever Sabah and Tamparuli Living Arts Center (TaLAC), both based in Sabah.

I-Lann has worked in art department and as a production designer in the Malaysian film industry since 1994 and between 2003-2008 established the production design department and lectured at Akademi Seni Budaya dan Warisan Kebangsaan (ASWARA). With her partner, rock n roll subculture archivist, musician and designer Joe Kidd they share KerbauWorks a cross-discipline project label and space. She is currently a Board member for Forever Sabah and Tamparuli Living Arts Center (TaLAC), both based in Sabah and a co-founding partner of KOTA-K Studio in Tanjung Aru Old Town, Kota Kinabalu.
